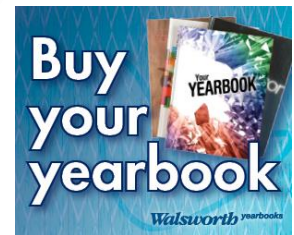

From Edline to Parent/Student 360

Frederick County Public Schools will begin using a new student information system from Tyler Technologies called Parent/Student 360 in the 2016-17 school year. Parent/Student 360 is replacing Edline and will provide parents and students with a variety of information including student schedules, grades and attendance data. Over the next few weeks, parents and students will receive a user name and password that will allow them to login to Parent/Student 360. The Parent/Student 360 link can be found under Parents & Students on the school division's website and each individual school website.

FCPS Rapid Communication System Text Messages

The Frederick County Public Schools' Rapid Communication System includes a SMS text message function. In order to receive text messages sent through the FCPS Rapid Communication System, parents must have the phone number of the device on which they want to receive text alerts included on their child's student record. In addition, they must opt-in to receiving the text messages if they have not done so previously. To opt-in, text "Yes" to 67587 from the device on which you want to receive text messages. Once the opt-in process has been completed, you will receive a confirmation text message. The FCPS Rapid Communication System is used to contact parents in a variety of situations ranging from severe weather and power outages to other emergencies that may cause a school to evacuate, relocate or lockdown. The system also is utilized to inform parents when schools are closed, opening late or closing early due to inclement weather. Individual schools also utilize the system to communicate information to their school communities.



Students that have a medical condition that may require intervention or medication during school hours should have a medication form and/or plan of care from their physician on file in the clinic with the appropriate signatures. Health forms can be found on the FCPS website by clicking "Parents & Students" and then clicking on "Health Forms" on the right side of the page. These forms must be renewed every school year. If you have any questions, please contact the school nurse.

September

- Dual Enrollment paperwork and payment is due to Mr. Bucher by September 6th.
- School Counselors will be making presentations to the seniors regarding post-graduation options and the steps to take to get there. This includes college, scholarships, financial aid, the military and employment resources.
- Each senior will meet with their counselor individually to review classes, sols and certifications needed for graduation as well as to help them plan for post-graduation. These meetings will occur in September and October.
- The Apple Blossom Mall will host the annual College and Career Fair on September 28 from 6:30-8:00. Plan to attend to speak with and get information from representatives of 2 and 4 year colleges, trade schools and the military.

PSAT Registration will begin September 6th in the Guidance Office:

Students interested in taking the PSAT can register to take the test in the Guidance office. You will need to pay at the time you register. The cost of the test this year is \$15.00. Checks should be made payable to Sherando High School. If you are paying in cash please have exact change. The test will be administered on the morning of Oct. 19th at Sherando. There is no makeup date for the PSAT. Space is limited so interested students are encouraged to register early. Students should see Mrs. Butler or Mrs. Hansen in the guidance office before school, during their study hall period, or after school to register for the test. **The deadline to register is September 22nd.**
